

Kebab Shop in Church Street, Romsey Application to extend hours

As you may be aware, in October a meeting was called by residents of the Church Street area to discuss the problems that they are experiencing late at night from noise and antisocial behaviour. I attended the meeting as a representative of King John's House. From time to time King John's House suffers damage and vandalism, and recently a large pot was stolen from diase வக்கள் tagane orgine sedal atagin brown and a the fact that King John's House has locked gates.

Residents of Church Street are concerned that the kebab shop is open after the pubs are closed, which means that it attracts customers (many of them drunk) who would otherwise not come to this area, and it is felt that this is the cause of much of the _antisocial_behaviour we are experiencing.

The kebab shop itself does not sell alcohol. It serves a very useful function in providing fast food until late, and we would wish this to continue. But now that some of the pubs in the centre of Romsey will be permitted to remain open longer, we would ask you not to allow the kebab shop to remain open after the pubs close.

Although not directly relevant to the granting of a licence, King John's House would welcome a police presence in the area when the licensed premises and the kebab shop close.
