Prevention of Crime and disorder,

On the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006, the premises remained open beyond it's permitted hours. There was a large group gathered outside. A fight occurred and one person was arrested. The premises was trading until 0340 hrs. Door supervisors intervened but were not wearing their flourescent jackets.

On the 8/1/6 the premises remained open beyond the permitted hours to 0345. The door staff left before the premises closed, they were not wearing their flourescent jackets as required to do so by the conditions of the premises licence. Staff were seen sweeping the shop floor out onto the pavement.

On the 14/1/6 the premises was again open beyond 0300 despite receiving a letter from the Police on the 10/1/6

The owner of the premises has indicated that the staff already put up with a degree of intimidation and abuse.

A reduction in the hours that the premises would remain open will assist in preventing crime and disorder. The premises already has conditions attached to it when it converted to the premises licence. I don't feel that any tightening of these conditions are appropriate. The fact that the premises has remained open beyond it's permitted hours has contributed to the crowds gathering in the area

On New Years Day at 0325 hours there was a fight outside or near to the premises. Chick o land was found to be open at the time beyond their permitted hours of 0300. Door supervisors were trying to deal with the incident but were not wearing any fluorescent jackets as required by the conditions of the licence. This made them difficult to identify and I understand one Police officer started to restrain the door supervisor. Police officers noted that there was a group of persons both inside and outside of the premises.

At 0340 hours the same morning the premises was again visited by Police officers. There were a number of people inside and food was still being served. A member of staff inside told the officers that they had been given permission to open later by the council.

On the 8th January 2006 the premises were found to be open at 0340 in the morning and serving food. The door supervisors inside the premises were not wearing their reflective jackets. At 0311 hrs PS Curtis entered the premises and spoke to staff. At 0335 hrs the door supervisors walked out of the premises and did not return. At 0347 a member of staff was seen sweeping from within the shop out onto the pavement outside.

On the 10th January, Inspector Gravenor sent a letter to the premises licence holder, advising them of their obligations and seeking assurances that there would be no further breaches.

At 0305 hours on the 14/1/6 PC WEARN from Andover Police entered the premises as it was still open. She asked to see a copy of the premises licence. The staff were unable to produce it. Door staff from the nearby club were seen to enter Chick o land after this time and collect food which had apparently been pre ordered.

On the 16th January at 1245 I went to the premises. I noted that the summary of the premises licence was not publicly displayed. Later that day I had a meeting with the owner of Chickoland, Ramazan BILGIC. During this meeting Mr BILGIC advised me that to close the doors at 3am would present problems for his staff as in the past, people have started kicking the windows in an effort to enter the shop. He also told me that his staff tolerate a lot of abuse from the customers and he does not report it to the Police.

I have a copy of a letter from an agent of Chick o Land, Elizabeth Bilgic, dated the 16/1/6, the second paragraph of which states that the reasons for opening beyond 0300 were due to the extreme volume of customers in the premises at that time making it impossible to close and was necessary for the safety of the staff and the doorstaff and to prevent damage to the premises.

A prosecution is being considered in relation to any breaches.
