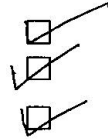

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a) On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- c) On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- d) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- e) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- f) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31<sup>st</sup> December)
- g) On Christmas day, as provided by the rules of the club and notified in writing by the chairman or secretary of the club to the chief executive of the justices for the petty sessions area in which the premises are. The said hours shall:
  - i) Not exceed six and half hours;
  - ii) Not begin earlier than 12 noon;
  - iii) Not end later than 10.30 p.m.
  - iv) Provide for a break of at least 2 hours including 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.
  - v) Not extend for more than three and a half hours after 5 p.m.
- l. The above restrictions do not prohibit
  - during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
  - during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
  - during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied as ancillary to the meals;
  - the supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing.

**The above conditions shall not apply on up to 12 occasions a year where the Club has notified the Police and Licensing Authority that licensable activities shall be provided until 0000 hours.**

**During events involving live or amplified music and speech (other than low level background music) all windows and doors shall be kept closed and external doors will also be kept closed where necessary except for access and egress.**


We write as neighbours of Romsey Comrades Club to object to the application (28.02.2006) to vary the club premises certificate.

The club premises certificate granted on 16.01.2006 permits qualifying activities during limited hours in the middle of the day and in the evenings. The application to vary seeks permission for qualifying activities from 10.00 am until evening closing time. We object to the variation for the following reasons:

1. If this variation is granted, whenever it chooses (and regardless of assurances) the club will be entitled to have live or recorded music throughout the day and evening. Up to now the music has almost always been limited to Saturday evenings and bank holiday evenings. If audible music is played during the day, this will spoil the enjoyment of our garden. Unlike the Romsey Tavern, where music is audible outside the premises on weekend afternoons, the Comrades Club is situated in a residential area with houses close by. If music audible outside the club is played during the day this will change the character of the area.
2. One assumes that the proposed variation of hours is designed to make the club more attractive to present and anticipated future members and to their guests. There will be an increase in the number of cars. The parking on the club premises is limited. At present in the evenings, at weekends, cars park in the surrounding roads, in particular The Harrage and Wakefield Court. This causes problems which will be made worse.

If the proposed variation was merely to permit the sale and supply of alcohol between 10.00 am and closing time, we would not object. This would merely be reinstating the position under the Licensing Act 1964.

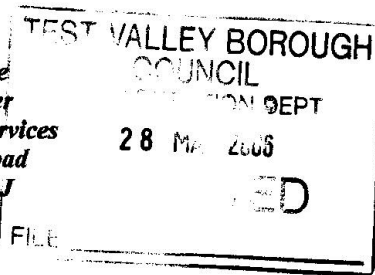

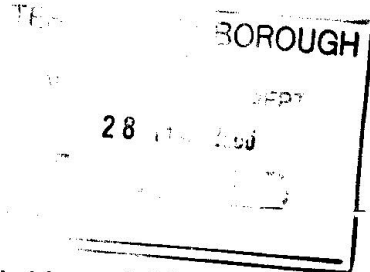

Many Romsey residents already suffer noise pollution emanating from various functions from Broadlands. We feel, therefore, this further irritant would add to the cacophony.

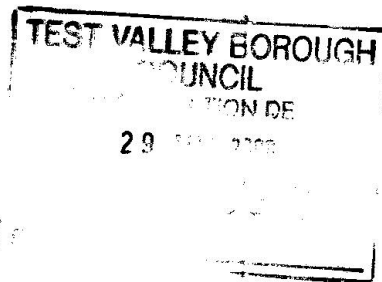
There would also be a disproportionate increase in vehicles - already the overflow from their car-park has been onto double yellow lines adjacent to the club premises.
