Analyst Report

Incidents within a 5 mile radius of The George, 1/7/07-1/7/08:

Executive Summary: The following report is based solely on incidents within a 5 mile radius of The George, Middle Wallop, it does not include any incidents which have occurred at the premises. Given the low levels of crime in the area, The George contributes significantly to the issues, mainly around the cross roads where it is situated and the Pound road area. It is estimated between 45 and 53 incidents in the last 13 months are linked to The George Inn.


Method: Hampshire Constabulary's Record Management System was examined for all occurrences reported between 1/7/07-10/8/08. These were then reduced to all occurrences with a start time after 2000, and before 0830 in the morning. Where overnight incidents were part of series, these were included. They were then subjectively read to see if they were or might be related to The George. Burglaries for example were generally excluded, however criminal damage was usually deemed related.

Premise: Late night incidents of vandalism or Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Nether Wallop, Over Wallop, Middle Wallop are likely to be related to the night time economy. The pub most likely to be related to this is The George. The last two reported problems at the White Hart, were in 2003 and 2004 respectively. The Five Bells has had only 1 report of criminal damage from a drunken patron, this was in 2006.

Overview of Incidents:

Y – The analyst thinks the incident is related to the premises
Onight – incidents which occurred overnight
M – The analyst thinks the incident may be related to the premises



October 2007, will be covered in more detail later in the report. However it is suggested that 45-53 incidents in the last 13 months.




Figure 2 – Incidents subjectively decided by the analyst to be plausibly linked to The George, by month and Occurrence type, (1/7/07-10/8/08)

It can be seen that main associated problems are damage or vandalism (the theft from vehicle were vandalism to aerials), followed by rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour. Some of the reports suggest that incidents are being caused by juveniles who are buying alcohol from the premises, getting drunk and causing problems.

ear Month

Supporting Evidence:

The 23 incidents happened between 0240-0400 and involved persons who had been drinking at the George Inn, and resulted in 18 vehicles being damaged. This is covered in more detail later.

Female has been drinking in the pub, she returns home drunk and enters bedroom of sleeping partner and assaulted him between 0200 and 0300.

21:08 – 16-17 year olds wandering in and out of The George being loud, rowdy and a nuisance to nearby residents.

02:03 – Informant reports seeing 2 males and a female staggering outside her house. No evidence persons were drinking at The George, however the time frame is suggestive.

The case is weaker for the following incidents:

Two males in drink playing chicken on A343 (about 500m from The George). Two security lights damaged (44080306162) in Pound Road

October 2007 – There was a party at The George Inn. Following this, there was a substantial amount of damage overnight to cars in the Pound road area. 18 cars were damaged, 16 had aerials snapped off or taken, and two had wing mirrors snapped off and tyres damaged. Information suggests the person(s) who did this had been drinking at the George and one was underage. Also related to this was a public order incident where by a person was being abusive to someone in the street at 2:40 am, and knocking over bins, in the car park where about 8-10 aerials were damaged.
