**Rownhams House Licensing Application**

I wish to object to this application on the following grounds

**Prevention of crime and disorder**

The link with crime and disorder and the consumption of alcohol is well established. My house is directly opposite the footpath used by any people leaving Rownhams House by foot to travel west. The path then links with Balmoral Way and any late night Rownhams House revellers on this route walk directly under a bed room. There has been a history of low level disorder in the area (hence the wardens) and last year I had to intervene with a woman being assaulted by a drunken partner directly outside the house which greatly upset my daughter.

**The prevention of public nuisance**

This is a residential area and any event has the potential to be a public nuisance. The entrance to the House is off a small residential road simply not designed for the volume of traffic such events will create. I don't know about car parking for the events but if it is on the surrounding residential roads, further nuisance will be created. My house is directly opposite the footpath used by any people leaving Rownhams House by foot to travel west. The path then links with Balmoral Way and any late night Rownhams House revellers on this route walk directly under a bed room. Any drunken or noisy people leaving the event will create a public nuisance.

**Promotion of public safety**

The sale and consumption of alcohol does simply not promote public safety, especially in the evening. I work in the NHS and you only need to go to the General A&E to see the impact.
