Jason Mark HAMMONDS has applied to transfer the premises licence for Abbey Hotel, Romsey to his name. He proposes his partner, Tanya DICKSON as Designated Premises Supervisor.

Hampshire Constabulary are satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of Mr Hammonds' previous actions at Licensed Premises are such that granting the application would undermine the crime prevention objective.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> February 2010 Mr Hammonds' and his brother were involved in a series of incidents in Romsey town centre, the second of which was reported to police. An emergency call came from the DPS of The Star PH that two males who had been removed from The Tavern PH earlier in the day were now in William IV PH and causing problems there. She reported that a lot of damage was believed to have been caused and was concerned as they appeared to be 'doing the rounds' whilst very much in drink.

On investigating this incident it transpires that a 'massive fight' had broken out during which 20 glasses had been broken and a bar stool. No formal complaint was made in terms of the criminal damage and therefore nobody was arrested. However, in his assessment of the incident PC 3331 MILLS states that 'At about 2150hrs 2 males, \*\*\* and also HAMMONDS, entered the William Fourth P/H and started to cause problems. They were looking for \*\*\*\*\*\*\* because of their suspicions that he was in some form of relationship with \*\*\*\*\*\*\*.' The report goes on to say that 'Given the circumstances I suspect that more occurred, e.g. assaults and more damage'.

This incident was discussed at a Pub Watch meeting and on the 19<sup>th</sup> February 2010 Mr Hammonds received a 1 year ban, which concluded on 30/03/2011.

On 12<sup>th</sup> March 2011, weeks before the conclusion of the Pub Watch ban Mr Hammonds was issued with a fixed penalty notice having committed an offence contrary to S5 Public Order Act 1986 in Winchester City Centre. The circumstances are detailed in the statement of Police Sergeant 1452 FISHER. Mr Hammonds was ejected from O'Neills Bar in Winchester for 'disrespectable' behaviour and was then arguing with the door staff, refusing to leave the premises and smoking in the doorway. PS FISHER attempted to issue Mr Hammonds with a Direction to Leave Notice under S27 Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006. Mr Hammonds

became aggressive, threatening in his manner, and repeatedly swore in the presence of the Sergeant and other members of the public. As a result Mr Hammonds was arrested for the public order offence. It is also evidenced within the statement of PS FISHER that Mr Hammonds was drunk. This incident causes concern firstly that Mr Hammonds, whilst drunk in a licensed premises, committed a crime. Secondly, Mr Hammonds demonstrates a repeated lack of understanding of the licensing objectives.

The police are not aware of any other instance where somebody previously banned from Pub Watch has applied to become a premises licence holder in the same area as the Pub Watch ban. This is then compounded by the most recent public order offence, leading police to believe that the circumstances of the case are exceptional. Mr Hammonds has demonstrated a propensity towards violence when in drink, a lack of ability to drink in moderation, and through his actions has seriously undermined the licensing objectives. The police believe that allowing Mr Hammonds to become a premises licence holder would result in the licensing objectives being further undermined, and that in a position of responsibility such as this, that the consequences of this would have a significant impact on the community.

### It is an offence, under section 158 of the Licensing Act 2003 to make a false statement in or in connection with this representation

Police recommendations (including any conditions)

That Mr Hammonds is not able to become premises licence holder at the premises.

It is anticipated that regardless of the outcome of this objection, Mr Hammonds will have a level of involvement with the premises. It is recommended that in order to safeguard the promotion of the licensing objectives, the following conditions be added to the license:

### **CCTV**

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside of the premises covering the entrance and exit. The system should be able to cope with strobe lighting and all levels of illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas. The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity.

All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff available during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies on request of the Police or local authority. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc or VHS.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

Recordings to be kept for a minimum of 28 days.

The DPS or premises manager must be able to demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. password protected. In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Southampton Police Licensing Unit.

#### Incident book

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises and there will be a daily debrief of door staff (where used) at the close of business which will be evidenced in writing by the Manager on duty. Should there be no incidents then this will also be recorded at the end of the shift in the incident book.

The incident book will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police

upon request.

The book shall detail in brief, incident of injury/ejection/refusals/drug misuse/ i.d seizure/age challenge. Where there is an injury, ejection of physical altercation the entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author. If the member of staff involved has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another party. This should however be read back to the person involved and counter signed. Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party.

### Refusals book

A refusals book to be kept detailing numbers, dates and times of incident and description of people refused service of alcohol with reasons why to the reasonable satisfaction of Hampshire Constabulary. The refusals book will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police upon request.

### Training

Staff are trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18; signs and symptoms of drunk persons, refusal of sale due to intoxication and that records are kept of such training, which are signed and dated by the member of staff who has received the training; that staff receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and that records are signed and dated by the member of staff are kept of this refresher training. Records will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and the Licensing Authority. Records will be kept for a minimum period of two years.

HAMMONDS started to try and walk past me. I tried to explain to him that I was going to give him the Direction to Leave notice and he would then have to leave the Town Centre. HAMMONDS refused to listen and said: "FUCK OFF I'M GOING UP HERE" (looking to Jewry Street). As he said this, he had raised his voice and there were members of the public walking past. Due to HAMMOND's behaviour, I had already used my police radio to ask for another officer to attend my location as I felt that HAMMONDS could start to assault me.
HAMMONDS refused to give me his name and address. When other police officers arrived, he continued to be obstructive and refused to comply with my requests. As a result of his repeated swearing at me, at 0050 hours I said to HAMMONDS: "I am arresting you for Section 5 Public Order."
I then cautioned him HAMMONDS made no reply after Caution. The arrest was necessary for a prompt and effective investigation.
Due to his aggressive behaviour, I placed handcuffs on HAMMONDS. These were applied in a side by side position t his front and double locked.
When HAMMONDS was swearing at me, he was doing it in Jewry Street. This is one of the main streets in Winchester for the pubs and clubs and is a busy thoroughfare at this time of night with members of the public regularly walking along it. As such, any members of the public walking past would have been able to hear HAMMONDS swearing.
HAMMONDS smelt strongly of intoxicating liquor and he was a bit unsteady on his feet. His eyes were glazed and his speech was slurred. I formed the opinion that he was drunk. As I took HAMMONDS to the rear of the police van, he almost fell to the ground as he tried to get into the rear cage. HAMMONDS was then placed in the rear of the police van and conveyed by PC24242 DOYLE to Winchester Police Station.
I would describe HAMMONDS as a white male, aged in his forties and approx. 5'8" tall. He had receding dark brown hair and a proportionate build. HAMMONDS was wearing a grey hoody top with a cartoon character on the front. He wore light blue jeans and black training shoes.
I have had no further dealings with HAMMONDS.
