The police wish to review the current premises licence for The Foresters Arms, Andover, Hampshire. The premise has recently been the subject of serious disorder which has resulted in some substantial injuries and on two occasions glass has been used as a weapon.

Following is a summary of the incidents that have caused concern:

March 2012 - A male inside the premise threw a pint glass behind the bar, this glass is described as missing a staff members face by inches, this male then left the premise. The premise did not report this to the police which in turn led to no disclosure by the police of a photograph of the offender to the pubwatch scheme. This male was voted onto pubwatch by its members.

April 2012 - A female inside the premise, threatened to assault the landlady, this threat was then made more serious by further threatening to glass a customer. The same female then attempted to attack another customer which resulted in a member of staff trying to eject the female and in the receiving a nasty bite wound to this arm. Once the female was eventually ejected she continued to attack the front door until her arrest by police. In interview the female described herself as being drunk on the evening in question and that she was between an 8 and 9 on a scale of 1-10. It is clear that this female was being served whilst under the influence of alcohol, this female was also voted onto pubwatch by its members.

June 2012 - A male inside the premise was trying to make conversation with an acquaintance over a previous falling out. The offending male began tapping the victim on the arm to which the victim told the male to "LEAVE IT OUT" with this the male then struck the victim with a pint glass to the left side of his face causing a cut to victims face which later led him to hospital. This incident was reported to police and as a result the offending male was arrested and also voted onto pubwatch by its members. The severity of the incident was enough that the offending male in this incident was sentenced to 13 months in prison.

Both males left the premise and later became involved in another altercation which resulted in the arrest of the original offender.

The view of the police is that one glassing incident is too many to request stricter safety measures, however two glassing incidents within a 4 month period and an additional threat of violence with glass, clearly shows the seriousness of this situation.

Further to this, the police have recently sought the advice of the Independent Advisory Group on the use of polycarbonate glass in the Night Time Economy. The IAG comprises of representatives from a cross section of diverse communities in Northern Hampshire. The IAG considers issues affecting the whole organisation including policy & procedure, critical incidents & operation practice and planning.

The role of the IAG members is to:

1. Advise the police & partners in community matters
2. Listen to, reflect and support diverse experiences of the community
3. Give real experiences to the IAG (group)
4. Work as part of a team to query, advise & comment to the police and partners which include Hampshire County Council

The IAG gave their full support to the police and recommended that polycarbonates be implemented as standard to town centre premises during the night time economy trade.

During mediation with the premise there was a huge amount of resistance to the suggestion of implementing a complete polycarbonates policy. The owner of the premise stated during mediation that most of there customers would not drink through a polycarbonate vessel and that they already had strict measures in place, we were also informed that the premise had a policy that polycarbonates would be used from approximately 6pm, all of the incidents I listed above occurred after 6pm and all involved glass. The premise has also had a quantity of polycarbonate vessels provided to them by the police which on attending the premise were in a box and not in the bar.

As a result of the severity of the aforementioned incidents it is the policy of Andover Police and with the support of Chief Superintendent Chatterton, that a polycarbonate policy be implemented in premises where glassing incidents have occurred.

Therefore the police respectfully request that the sub-committee impose the following condition to this premises licence:

Polycarbonates to be used at all times that licensable activites are taking place.
