Hampshire Constabulary wish to apply for a review for the premises under the Licensing objectives - The prevention of Crime and Disorder and the the protection of Children against Harm.

The premise failed a test purchase operation carried out by the police on 30th July 2011 - whereby a 16year old female was sold alcohol. The female cashier was issued an £80.00 penalty notice.

The Police met with the store to discuss the failure. At this meeting it was agreed by the DPS that the in store challenge 25 training would be brought forward for all staff. The deputy manager had also been put forward for a personal licence.

Trading Standards met with the store to discuss the Police test purchase operation on 6th August 2011.

Followed by a test purchase operation on 6th August 2011 which passed.

They repeated this again on 14th September 2011 again resulting in a pass.

The premise failed a test purchase operation on 29th March 2012, carried out by the Police, whereby 2x 16 year old females purchased alcohol through the self service tills - both sales were authorised by the same staff member who received an £ 80.00 penalty notice.

The Police met with the DPS and discussed the failure - training records fro the staff were produced which were current, challenge 25 policy was in place throughout the store.

As a result of the test purchase failure Tesco immediately changed the DPS for the store.

The Police stated that they were to seek a closure order for the store as a result of the double failure. Trading standards were advised of this 3rd April 2012.

The closure notice was sought from Chief Superintendent Mark Chatterton.

11th May 2012 Trading standards carried out a further test purchase operation, and again the store failed. A 16 year old female as sold alcohol through the self service tills and the sale was authorised by a female member of staff.

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18th May 2012 the police served the closure notice on Tesco Metro. The closure period applied for was 48 hours over the Jubilee weekend. This notice was accepted by Tesco.

Tesco applied again to change the DPS again after the final failure.

The police have worked alongside trading standards to address the issues with the persistent sale of alcohol from this store.

Despite the closure notice being issued the store has a history of 4 failed test purchase operations within the past year.

This is totally unacceptable.

Tesco have changed DPS after each failure, and the store continues to make sales of alcohol to persons less than 18 years.

Trading Standards have called for the review of the licence on this premise and this action is supported by the Police.

The police do not wish to make representations on how this matter should be dealt with. We support the trading standards application, but feel that the decision on action taken (if any) should be left for the Licensing panel to decide.

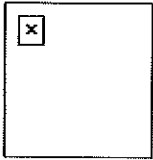
