### Please state the ground(s) for review (please read guidance note 2)

There are two grounds for review as below.

#### 1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Mr Bora is trading illegally as he does not hold a Street Trading Consent from the Council under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. This follows the resolution of the Licensing Committee on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2017 (see supporting information below). Therefore, he cannot have a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, allowing him to trade between certain hours, when he has no legal consent to be there as a street trader at any time in the first place.

### 2. Public Safety

The presence of Mr Bora on Premier Way, Romsey presents a risk to public safety. Specifically that although he is not parked directly on the double yellow lines that have been painted at the southern end of the road where he continues to trade, his customers do. This interferes with sight lines and the safe movement of traffic.

Given the above, I ask that the Premises Licence that Mr Bora holds from the Council under the Licensing Act 2003 permitting the provision of late night refreshment be reviewed and revoked.

Mr Bora used to hold a Street Trading Consent granted by the Council under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. This allowed him to trade from the road side near the southern end of Premier Way, Romsey. However, when he applied for this to be renewed for the 2017/18 period there was an objection from Mr S Raw, the Council's Engineering and Transport Manager. His grounds for objection were that double yellow lines were going to be painted on the section of Premier Way Mr Bora traded at. Mr Bora appealed against the decision to refuse renewal of his Street Trading Consent. This eventually led to the case coming before the Licensing Committee on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2017.

At the appeal hearing the Licensing Committee resolved to permit Mr Bora to have Street Trading Consent for a short further period only, expiring on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2017. This was to allow him trading time at the pitch up to the point when it was anticipated that the double yellow lines would be painted on the road.

Despite the Licensing Committee's decision, Mr Bora has remained at the pitch ever since without Street Trading Consent. Further, this is despite the double yellow lines having been painted. His response to the double yellow lines has been to drive his vehicle each trading day over the kerb, across the pavement, and on to the adjacent verge. He continues to trade from a pitch on the verge close enough to the highway requiring him to have Street Trading Consent. However, no consent has been given because of the original objections from the Engineering and Transport Manager. Although Mr Bora does not park on the double yellow lines directly, his customers have been witnessed doing so. For example, on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018 by Mr Dean Bennett, Environmental Protection Officer.

Although Mr Bora does not have Street Trading Consent from the Council he does still trade from the site. He holds a Premises Licence from the Council under the Licensing Act 2003 allowing the provision of late night refreshment from 23:00 – 02:00 hours Sunday to Thursday and from 23:00-03:00 hours Friday and Saturday.

He is trading illegally by remaining at the site without Street Trading Consent. His presence also presents the same risks to public safety that the Council's Engineering and Transport Manager originally envisaged, and which led to the Licensing Committee's resolution on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2017 permitting him to only remain at the pitch on Premier Way, Romsey until 31<sup>st</sup> October 2017.
